# MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES

#### **September 12, 2022**

The Montgomery County Board of Education convened in a regular monthly meeting on Monday, September 12, 2022, at 6:30 pm in the Montgomery County Schools Boardroom. Board members present were Steve W. DeBerry – Chair, Tommy Blake - Vice Chair, Jesse Hill, Lynn Epps, Anne Evans, Bryan Dozier and Cindy Taylor.

Chairman Steve DeBerry called the meeting to order. Mr. DeBerry moved to adopt the agenda as submitted. Bryan Dozier made the motion with Lynn Epps seconding. The agenda was accepted with unanimous approval from the board.

Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Budget Resolution

The district's initial budget, or Budget Resolution, is established according to the portion of the budget code known as the purpose code and future budget amendments are approved based on subsequent changes to the purpose code amounts listed in the Budget Resolution. Within the state established 19-digit budget code system, the purpose code is the four-digit number which groups expenses according to what they are to be used for and are classified into 5 different purposes and are defined below:

5000 – Instructional Services

6000 – System-Wide Support Services

7000 – Ancillary Services (Child Nutrition)

8000 – Non-Program Charges (Federal In-direct Cost charges

9000 – Capital Outlay Expenses

The district anticipates receiving revenues from state, federal, country and grant sources along with donations from pravate sources in the 2002/2003 fiscal year. Based on these sources of fundings, a evenue and expense budget has been established for Monogenery Country School, categorized by funding source and purposes code. #### 5) FirstHealth MOU

Chairman DeBerry called upon Sloan Bourgeois, Principal of Mt. Gilead Elementary. Mrs. Bourgeois called upon Adriane Clarett and Skylar Quick a fifth grader, for their presentation "Girls as Pearls." Principal Bourgeois stated this program is the work of Assistant Principal Adrianne Clarett. They wanted to focus on program options for after school. They have partnered with a local church working to come up with extra-curricular activities with members of the church to share their hobbies with students. The aim is to encourage and lead students toward becoming familiar with and advocate for issues and topics that affect young girls today at home, in school, and in their communities. The group has grown from eight last year to fifteen this year. Students meet 1-2 times a month. The group focuses on building self-esteem through supportive group meetings, enrichment activities, etiquette workshops, and community service projects. We

ask these young ladies to respect themselves and others. The need for them to be successful academically is reinforced on a consistent basis. We help students develop the strengths they already have and identify new ones. The girls also have assignments to complete between meetings. Mrs. Clarett asked Skylar Quick to describe what it means to her to be a G.A.P. Girl. Skylar stated it means you are your own best friend. She has learned to push negative thoughts out of her head and to keep on keeping on. She is inspired by people who stand up to bullies. They are fierce, strong and brave. She has learned to love herself and to never let someone put you down because you are enough.

Chairman DeBerry called upon Emily Shaw for the "Camp Timberwolf" presentation. Wade Auman and Heather Seawell started the inaugural year of this program and then COVID happened. We were pleased to be able to do the full four days this year. It was held July 11-14, 2022, on the campuses of Montgomery Central and MCS Early College. We invited all our rising ninth graders. We had an average of 35 students per day. They enjoyed four days of STEM classes. Our purpose was to showcase the CTE Center, MCS Early College and Montgomery Central High School. In hopes that students would be familiar with each campus and see pathways that are offered to them. Students enjoyed several field trips aligned with current pathways. Virtual reality googles were purchased and students loved them. Virtually the students could change oil in cars and bake cakes. They have a committee to plan for next year. Eighth graders are already starting to ask for it.

Chairman DeBerry called upon Tracy Grit for the "New Hiring System" presentation. We have implemented a new hiring system this week. Applicant Tracking is offered free from PowerSchool and is replacing the current Teacher Match system that is beginning phased out across the state. Training will begin September 14, 2022. We found that it is user friendly and a simple process.

Chairman DeBerry called upon Tracy Grit for Policy 4302-R Rules for Use of Seclusion and Restraint in Schools. Chairman DeBerry asked for a motion for approval. Mr. Grit asked to remove the existing policy and reinstate the previous version. Chairman DeBerry asked for a motion to waive the policy for first read. Bryan Dozier made the motion with Cindy Taylor seconding. Chairman DeBerry asked for a motion to remove the existing policy and reinstate the previous version. Chairman DeBerry called upon Dr. Dale Ellis for his "Superintendent's Remarks." It has been an amazingly smooth start to the school year. I would like to thank our principals, teachers and staff. We have had a small bus issue today and small curriculum issue. But overall, when you look at it and hear about issues from other counties, especially transportation. Our principals, our transportation department, Mr. Woodard and auxiliary services, have done a fantastic job getting things moving this year. They are getting kids to school and home safely. I have started the process of going around to faculties about moral and concerns. People are generally happy and excited about the school year. There are a lot of reasons for that. I try to communicate the support they have from this board of education. The support you provide as a board of education is truly appreciated. You don't know how far a doughnut will go until you give everyone one. It is a phenomenal start to the school year. I send my kudos out to the principals, office administrators, staff, teachers, child nutrition assistants, and you name it. We have a great group of people here. I have always said the best thing about Montgomery County is the people. Our people have done a great job and they are appreciated.
