Policy Code:

2116

A person who has been impeached from any office or adjudged guilty of a felony, corruption, or malpractice in any office and who has not been restored the rights of citizenship is disqualified for office.

A member of the local board of education who changes residence such that he or she is no longer entitled to vote in an election for the office he or she holds is disqualified from continuing to hold office.

A board member who becomes disqualified for office may be subject to removal under G.S. 1-515

In addition, as provided by G.S. 14-230, a board member who willfully and corruptly omits, neglects or refuses to discharge any of the duties of office or who willful and corruptly violates the oath of office is subject to removal from office by a court.
