




# MCS Student COVID-19 Flow Chart A

## Student tests positive for COVID-19




# MCS Student COVID-19 Flow Chart B



## Student is exhibiting at least one symptom of COVID-19

COVID-19 Symptoms: fever (temperature of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher), sore throat, cough (those with chronic cough, a change in their cough from baseline), difficulty breathing (those with asthma, a change in baseline breathing), new loss of taste or smell, diarrhea or vomiting, new onset of severe headache.





# MCS Student COVID-19 Flow Chart C

Student has been in close contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19 (close contact is within 6 feet for 15 minutes or longer)

Isolate student immediately to designated area. Notify parent/ guardian of need for student to quarantine.

Classmates should self-monitor for signs and symptoms.

Recommend testing immediately. Notify local health department of suspected case.

Is student fully vaccinated for COVID-19? (has it been at least 2 weeks after receiving 2<sup>nd</sup> dose in 2-dose series or 1 dose of a single dose series vaccine)

Recommend testing 5-7 days after last exposure date to the positive case.

May return to school if they do not live in a congregate setting.

Student will continue to quarantine for 14 days from the last exposure to someone with a positive case.

Isolate student and report positive test to the Montgomery County Health Department at (910) 572-1393. Student must stay home until they can answer **YES** to all 3 questions:

- 1) Been at least 10 days since 1<sup>st</sup> symptoms or positive test (whichever is first)
- 2) Been at least 24 hours since had fever (without use of fever reducing medicines)
- 3) Been at least 24 hours since symptoms have improved including cough and shortness of breath

Continue to quarantine for 14 days from the last exposure to someone with a positive case.

Contact principal or school nurse before returning to school.
