MINUTES**

**September 9, 2019**

The Montgomery County Board of Education convened in its regular monthly meeting on Monday, September 9, 2019 at 6:30 pm at Montgomery County Schools Central Office. Board members present were Steve DeBerry – Chair, Tommy Blake – Vice Chair, Jesse Hill, Sandra Miller, Bryan Dozier, and Shirley Threadgill. Trikena Simmons was absent.

Chair Steve DeBerry called the meeting to order and moved to adopt the agenda as shown. Bryan Dozier made the motion with Sandra Miller seconding. The agenda was accepted with unanimous approval from the board.

Steve DeBerry read a devotional reminding us where we are and where we want to be depends on how hard we work.

Mt. Gilead Elementary students Aiden Arroyo and Aniya Arroyo led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Jeff Branch signed up to address the board during the public comment period. Jeff Branch informed us that North Carolina now requires all SROs to be state certified. All of Montgomery County SROs are now certified. Mr. Branch thanked Dr. Charles Dulin for his help in training with the Exceptional Children portion of the process. Delores Mauldin, Cindy Williams and Sherry Starnes were not in attendance. Mr. Taylor thanked each one of them for their dedication and hard work. This year proved to be a great year with seven perfect audits. The most we have had in a year.

Sloan Bourgeois, introduced the certified and classified employees of the month for Mt. Gilead Elementary. Lynn Barton, Pre-K Assistant and Bus Driver, is the classified employee of the month. Trician Bailey, second year Teacher now teaching first grade at Mt. Gilead Elementary and is from Jamaica, is the classified employee of the year. Mrs. Bourgeois thanked them for their hard work and dedication.

Chairman DeBerry asked to hold the consent agenda until closed session. The board unanimously agreed.

Sloan Bourgeois, Principal, and Mandy Hall, Teacher at Mt. Gilead presented a Power Point presentation entitled "The Next Step Forward in Guided Reading. A Framework by Jan Richardson." A video was shown with Mandy Hall using the technique with her students in the classroom. This program was implemented in April of 2019. Mrs. Bourgeois has seen great growth in reading since the start of this program. Board members asked if this model was intended to replace remaining programs. Mrs. Bourgeois explained this is an additional technique used with ReadyGen addressing gaps in foundational skills. This model assesses by ability not grade level. Mandy Hall is responsible for training other teachers at Mt. Gilead Elementary.

Superintendent Ellis presented a proclamation to officially declare September as Attendance Awareness Month with approval by the board. Bryan Dozier made a motion to approve. Sandra Miller seconded and the board unanimously approved. The proclamation reads as follows:

Proclamation of September as Attendance Awareness Month

- WHEREAS, regular attendance is essential to gain knowledge, training, and skills in the 21st century and
- WHEREAS, early chronic absence – missing 10 percent or more of school days for any reason (including medical and attendance excuses, or just two or three days a month – is associated with lower academic achievement, less likely to graduate, and a higher risk of dropping out;
- WHEREAS, regular attendance is vital to allow students to become proficient learners by the end of third grade; districts that do a blend of being proactive and responsive to the development of students and staff needed to prevent in-school absences;
- WHEREAS, all students – even those who are not regularly – are affected by chronic absence because teachers must spend time re-teaching for students who missed lessons; and
- WHEREAS, chronic absence is an early warning indicator that can reveal that a student needs help; help for the school, the student, and the family;
- WHEREAS, chronic absence exacerbates the achievement gap between students in low-income communities, rural and urban, and students of color; and
- WHEREAS, attendance is an achievable and effective way to access the quality of instruction, attendance by regular, good and improved attendance rate, engaging students and families, monitoring attendance rate and practice, providing parental/caregiver, teacher, and administrator, and developing systemic responses to attendance barriers; and
- WHEREAS, attendance is a key area reporting metric under the federal Every Student Succeeds Act and an area of focus for both the Language for Grade-level Proficiency and the North Carolina Pathways to Grade-Level Reading Initiative; and
- WHEREAS, improving attendance takes commitment, collaboration, and careful attention to the unique challenges of our communities; and
- WHEREAS, regular attendance can be significantly increased when schools, families and communities work together to monitor and proactively engage attendance and address barriers that might otherwise prevent a student from attending school.

Superintendent Ellis gave an update on the teacher supplement. Sarah Jordan donated \$50,000 to fulfill the teacher supplement of a nearly 25% increase. Shirley Threadgill made a motion to move forward with implementation and Bryan Dozier seconded. The board requests recognition for Sarah Jordan and county commissioners for their support.

Superintendent Ellis presented FAQ sheet for In Force 911. This mobile app will be for all Montgomery County employees allowing them the power to be a first responder. This app can send an alert to law enforcement faster than 911. In Force will be in addition to procedures that are already in place. Dr. Ellis recommended to the board that we move forward with this application immediately so that installation and training can begin. Bryan Dozier made the motion to approve Shirley Threadgill seconded.

Katie Hursey presented three designs for the Montgomery Central High School Seal designed by Roy Beaman. These designs explained by Roy Beaman represent the past and present of East and West Montgomery combining into Montgomery Central High School. The board was very complimentary of Mr. Beaman's work. Bryan Dozier made a motion to approve the first design Sandra Miller seconded. This design will be on for diploma seals. It was suggested to be used as an inlay on the floor along with many other applications. The designs and descriptions are listed below.

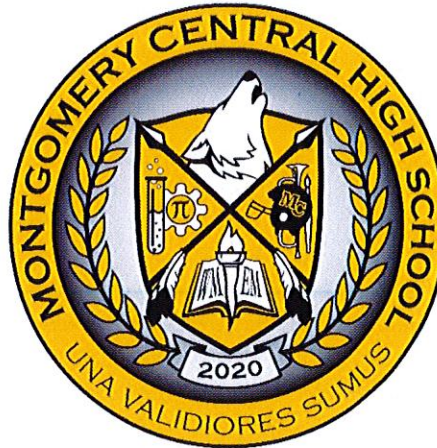

**Color and Meaning**

**Colors:** Black and Gold reflecting Montgomery Central High School official colors.

**Basic description:** The design is a shield with laurel leaves encircled by a continuous ring of English and Latin text.

- ◆ The ring is a symbol of perpetual unity with the Latin phrase "Una Validiores Sumus" (Together We Are Stronger) with the school name dominate in the layout.
- ◆ The Greek golden laurel wreath represents excellence in scholastic and athletic achievement with the official starting year of the school displayed in the banner between.
- ◆ The gold shield, a symbol of protection and strength, is traversed by two eagle feathers attached to tapered spears. The crossing spears symbolize the unification of East and West Montgomery (spears/West, eagle feathers/East), with the point of convergence emphasizing the MCHS Timberwolves mascot. The crossing spears create four quadrants on the shield, each representing qualities of scholastic and athletic achievement performed and zealously defended by the administrators, teachers and students of Montgomery Central High School.
  - Embellished in the left quadrant is the mathematical sign for pi, a steel gear and bobbing buoys. Representing the logical aspects of education in mathematics, technology and the sciences.
  - In the opposite quadrant a football helmet, trumpet and brush represent student achievement in the arts and athletic excellence.
  - The bottom quadrant shows an open book and flaming torch representing the search for academic knowledge through the light of revelation. The "Torch and Book" also symbolize a secondary meaning of Montgomery County divided by Little River with "West" to the geographic left and "East" to the geographic right. On the reverse of the book is "W.M." and "E.M." tribute to the previously separate high schools of West Montgomery and East Montgomery and their contributions over the decades to student achievement.
  - At the apex of the shield, overlooking the academic and athletic virtues of MCHS is the Timberwolves mascot. The symbolic lion representing Montgomery Central High School.



Superintendent Ellis presented a request from the Mount Gilead Community Foundation to erect a plaque on stage at the Leah Levin Auditorium at Mount Gilead Elementary in memory of Mr. Albert Johnson. Albert Johnson was responsible for raising money for repairs and updates of this auditorium when needed. Bryan Dozier made a motion to approve with Tommy Blake seconding.

Superintendent Ellis presented the beginnings of an application for nominating the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners for the Commissioners of the year award with the NC School Boards Association. Dr. Ellis requested approval from the board to move forward with application. Bryan Dozier made the motion to approve and Sandra Miller seconded.

Superintendent Ellis presented an update on construction at the site. A PowerPoint presentation was shown with progress being made throughout the campus. Overall it is starting to look more complete. Construction continues throughout the CTE Building and the main high school. Progress is being made on athletic fields, parking lots and courtyards. CTE substantial completion date is expected November 5, 2019. MCHS substantial completion date is expected March 24, 2020. Next progress meeting is scheduled for October 3, 2019.

During *Superintendent's Remarks*, Superintendent Ellis made comments regarding the Education Strategy Report (ESG Report) on planning behind the scenes. We are looking at workforce data. The flex labs that are being constructed and will allow the ability to change as needs arise. The report shows our partnership with MCC and describes what we are doing as one of a kind. Wesley Morris a Vanderbilt graduate has researched and no other system can be found that has a flagship high school and community college as an education complex like we have created. We are blessed to have what we are accomplishing. Dr. Ellis thanked everyone for their support.

Chairman DeBerry motioned to move to closed session. Tommy Blake motioned and Sandra Miller seconded. The board entered into closed session unanimously.


