

MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES

May 1, 2023

The Montgomery County Board of Education convened in a regular monthly meeting on Monday, May 1, 2023, at 6:30 pm in the Montgomery Central High School auditorium. Board members present were Steve W. DeBerry – Chair, Tommy Blake - Vice Chair, Angela Smith, Lynn Epps, Anne Evans, Bryan Dozier, and Cindy Taylor.

Chairman Steve DeBerry called the meeting to order. Mr. DeBerry moved to adopt the agenda as submitted. Bryan Dozier made the motion with Tommy Blake seconding. The agenda was accepted with unanimous approval from the board.

Chairman Steve DeBerry shared an opening with a reading from Matthew 7:14. “For the gate is small and the way is narrow that leads to life and few are those who find it.” Mr. DeBerry spoke about the 1914 fire that destroyed Edison Industries. At age 67 Thomas Edison watched his life’s work go up in flames. After the fire Mr. Edison stated that “there is a great value to disaster, all the mistakes are burned up, thank God we can start anew.” Three weeks after the fire Edison Industries produced the first phonograph. In every setback work to find a seed for future success. An inconvenience is only an adventure wrongly considered.

Chairman DeBerry led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

No one signed up to speak during the public comments section.

Dr. Ellis then called upon Enoc Robledo for the Certified and Classified Employees of the Month for Candor Elementary School. Francisco Cortes, Head Custodian was the classified winner. Effie Arces, Third Grade Teacher was the certified winner.

Dr. Ellis at this time recognized the winners of the 2023 Math Olympics. First place winner Peyton Strider (WMS), second place winner Phinley Hursey (EMS), and third place winner Anthony Perez (WMS).

Chairman DeBerry requested to approve the consent agenda as submitted. Bryan Dozier made the motion with Cindy Taylor seconding. The board approved unanimously.

Chairman DeBerry called upon Enoc Robledo for the Candor Elementary presentation “After School STEM Team”. Mr. Robledo then stated that three members of the after-school STEM team and their coaches were in attendance and would be presenting for Candor. At that time Mariyah Scott (5th), Maziyah McDonald (4th), and Aubrey Barnes (4th) introduced themselves to the board. They each took turns explaining what they do and learn in after school STEM. One of the areas they spoke about was Cryptography which is the science of enciphering and deciphering messages in secret code and the areas in real life where this is used. They also talked about and explained Bridge Building. In this activity they were challenged to build a bridge using pasta noodles and glue guns. They explained how they first had to decide on a shape that they thought would best absorb the load and then design a blueprint on wax paper for the bridge. Once their bridge was completed, they got to test the strength of their bridge. The

presentation included video of the students' placing books on top of each bridge to see how much weight their bridges would hold before breaking down. The students then explained Catapults and how they observed angles and concepts of motion. The challenge was to make a catapult from a variety of materials and then be able to catapult marshmallows with precision into the mouths of their partners. This completed their presentation. Mr. Robledo stated that this program has been used for the last two years and is for 4th and 5th graders. The board stated that the young ladies did an excellent job with their presentation.

Chairman DeBerry called upon Dr. Dale Ellis for the Teacher Appreciation Proclamation. Dr. Ellis stated that the proclamation before the board stating that the week of May 1-5 is National Teacher Appreciation Week, with May 2 being National Teacher Appreciation Day. There does appear to be some confusion with some organizations observing the week of May 1-5 and others May 8-12 but it was confirmed that National Teacher Day is May 2, 2023, therefore we will be honoring our teachers this week. Susanna and the Marketing staff got cookies and will be going out tomorrow on behalf of the board to deliver them to our teachers at each of our schools. It would be my recommendation to approve the Teacher Appreciation Proclamation presented to you tonight. Bryan Dozier made motion to approve with Lynn Epps seconding. The proclamation was approved unanimously by the board.

Chairman DeBerry called upon Dr. Dale Ellis for the MCHS new field lay-out options. Dr. Ellis stated that he wanted to bring this item before the board again tonight as he felt that he did not do a good job of explaining this item at last month's board meeting. From the beginning it was the job of the board to approve designs and layouts. It was the job of the county to approve funding. We went through the design process and once we had the design we wanted, we put it out to bid. The numbers came back but bigger than what was budgeted for at the time and when that happens you go through what is called value engineering. An example of value engineering would be the air conditioning in this auditorium. Back eighteen months ago when it came on you could not hear yourself think because it was so loud but that has since been fixed. Basically, everything that was on that value engineering list that had to be cut back for this school has been fixed. Items such as the field house that had to be pulled out of the project at first but had to be added back. All of that was to make sure there was enough money in that budget when all was said and done. We now have money that was left over that the county needs to use or return. The only things left that were changed from that original design are the items we have brought forth on the baseball field. Everything at this point comes down to a safety issue with putting up the netting and moving the dugouts back. The coaches have also requested a separate smaller field house for that area and a storage shed. We went back with the architect and the engineers because the county had paid for a survey to determine what the final design would look like to get the field to the level it needs to be. That design is what you have before you tonight with a request to approve that we move forward and present this design to the county commissioners as the design that we would like to have. We are not specifically asking for any money as ultimately it will be up to the county commissioners to approve the funding. The design was created in two phases. Phase one would be the most pressing as it includes the addition of the netting and the moving of the dugouts due to safety. Phase two would be the small field house and storage shed. Due to the unique nature of how this project was funded, it will be the call of the county whether to fund all, part, or none of this project. At the request of the board, \$200,000.000 was set aside from the capitol fund balance so therefore at the very least, if the county says no funding, we will have the money to spend for the addition of the netting which is a necessity due to safety. I request that you send this forward to the county as an approved design. Bryan Dozier made a motion to approve the submission of the design with Tommy Blake seconding. The submission of the design was approved unanimously by the board.

Chairman DeBerry then called upon Dr. Dale Ellis for the Superintendent's Comments. It is that sometimes fun time, sometimes crazy time of the year as we are gearing up for the testing session and graduations. Some of us have very close family members getting ready to go through that "senioritis" and wanting to get through that graduation part. Just an exciting time of the year. I just want to commend our staff on the great job they have done, and I also want to commend our students. I saw the young people tonight getting excited about STEM and saw other students excited about Math Olympics. We just have great kids in Montgomery County. I just want to thank the staff members that work with them. Our staff and board do such a great job encouraging everyone to work hard to get through that testing season. Just know that when you work hard it is going to take care of itself and no matter what the results are we will work on it. We look back and know that the kids have grown, and we know that they will grow even more this year. I could not be more excited about the end of the year, and I know you are as well. I appreciate the board's support and I know the staff do as well. We talked in our budget period about staff bonuses that will be going out in May and from my discussions with the certified staff advisory, they wanted you to know that they appreciate your efforts as well. On behalf of the staff thank you for your hard work in supporting them.

Chairman DeBerry then asked for a motion to go into closed session to discuss personnel and consult the board attorney. Bryan Dozier made the motion, with Lynn Epps seconding. The board approved entering closed session unanimously.

Fiscal Year 2022/2023 Budget Amendment # 8

State Funds

- 1) An increase of \$16.00 to the State Budget Fund (Fund 1):

\$16.00 increase to PRC 015 (Technology Program) – This is the quarterly distribution by the state of interest earned on the Indian Gaming funds which supports technology.

\$1560.26 increase to PRC 014 (CTE Programming – Purpose Code 6000) and a corresponding decrease of \$1560.26 to PRC 014 (CTE Programming-Purpose Code 5000 – No new funding was received, this was a transfer of funds within the existing budget moving funds from classroom level expenses (Purpose Code 5000) to district level expenses (Purpose Code 6000).

Local Funds

- 2) No change to the Local Fund Budget (Fund 2)

Federal Funds

- 3) No change to the total dollar amount of the Federal Fund Budget (Fund 3):

\$12,368.73 increase to PRC 171 (ESSER II Covid Funds – Purpose Code 5000) and a corresponding decrease of \$12,368.73 to PRC 171 (ESSER II Covid Funds-Purpose Code 8000 – No new funding was received, this was a transfer of funds within the existing budget moving funds to classroom level expenses (Purpose Code 5000) from Indirect Costs expenses (Purpose Code 8000).

\$119,679.01 increase to PRC 181 (ESSER II Covid Funds – Purpose Code 6000) and a \$119,728.04 increase to PRC 181 (ESSER II Covid Funds – Purpose Code 8000) and a corresponding decrease of \$307,307.05 to PRC 181 (ESSER II Covid Funds – Purpose Code 5000) – No new funding was received, this was a transfer of funds within the existing budget moving funds from classroom level expenses (Purpose Code 5000) to district level expenses (Purpose Code 6000) and to Indirect Costs expenses (Purpose Code 8000).

\$9637.08 increase to PRC 177 (Summer Learning Loss – Purpose Code 5000) and a corresponding decrease of \$9637.08 to PRC 177 (Summer Learning Loss Purpose Code 6000 – No new funding was received, this was a transfer of funds within the existing budget moving funds to classroom level expenses (Purpose Code 5000) from district level expenses (Purpose Code 6000).

\$850.00 increase to PRC 017 (CTE Programming – Purpose Code 6000) and a corresponding decrease of \$850.00 to PRC 017 (CTE Programming-Purpose Code 5000 – No new funding was received, this was a transfer of funds within the existing budget moving funds from classroom level expenses (Purpose Code 5000) to district level expenses (Purpose Code 6000).

Capital Outlay Funds

- 4) An increase of \$86,285.90 to the Capital Outlay Budget Fund (Fund 4):

\$1075.05 increase to PRC 802 (Capital Outlay Expenses) – New signage was purchased for Green Ridge Elementary.

\$11,837.00 increase to PRC 802 (Capital Outlay Expenses) – These funds were to replace the rubber tread on the stairs at MCHS.

\$4873.85 increase to PRC 802 (Capital Outlay Expenses) – These funds were to repair the scoreboard at MCHS.

\$48,500.00 increase to PRC 120 (Yellow Bus Lease Payment) – Under the direction of the DPI Transportation Department, the district enters a lease arrangement to finance the purchase of new yellow school buses. This allotment represents the funds to make the quarterly lease payment on our new yellow buses.

Child Nutrition

- 6) An increase of \$2116.90 to the Special Local Fund 8 Budget (Fund 8):

\$2116.90 increase to PRC 802 (Salvage Fees) – The district sold 3 old yellow buses that were no longer in service for salvage. These proceeds will be reimbursed to the State DPI Transportation Department.

7) Overall, these adjustments resulted in an increase of \$88,418.80 to the total 2022 - 2023 budget for Montgomery County Schools.

2023-24 ALTERNATIVE SCHOOLS' MODIFIED ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEM OPTIONS

This memo provides information on participating in the Alternative Schools' Modified Accountability System for the 2023-24 school year. The decision to participate must be filed with the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI), Office of Accountability and Testing by August 1, 2023. The State Board of Education policy (ACCT-008 (16 NCAC 06G-0314)) applies to all alternative schools, including charter schools approved to use the alternative accountability system (16 NCAC 06G-0519); Developmental Day Centers; and schools providing special education and related services in public separate settings to students with disabilities.

The alternative accountability system is a supplement to School Performance Grades (SPGs) as defined by G.S. §115C-83.15. It is not a substitute for the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requirements. Thus, alternative schools and other eligible schools participating in the modified system using Options B or C will also have a SPG calculated, if there is sufficient data, for federal identifications. The SPG is used to identify these schools for Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) or Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) as defined in the ESSA state plan. The designation of performance, as defined in ACCT-008 (16 NCAC 06G-0314), will be the designation displayed on the NC School Report Card and SPGs will not be used to determine low-performing school or low-performing district statuses.

Alternative School Modified Accountability System Option Determination

Schools participating in the modified system must annually submit their request. Schools may change the option from the prior year and are encouraged to review their previous selection. Charter schools submitting a request to participate must be approved to use the modified system in accordance with SBE Policy CHTR-020 (16 NCAC 06G-0518). As a reminder, local boards must approve the request at an official board meeting prior to submission to the SBE.

The current system allows eligible schools to participate in one of three Options, Option A, Option B, or Option C:

- Option A.** Alternative schools participate in School Performance Grades as defined by G.S. §115C-83.15, or
- Option B.** Alternative schools are evaluated as defined in 16 NCAC 06G-0314, attached below, or
- Option C.** Alternative schools propose modifications to the accountability system for approval by the State Board of Education. The State Board of Education shall approve proposed modifications to the system if a preponderance of the evidence proves that the modifications comprise valid and reliable measures of the achievement and growth of the school's students.

Option C requests must include an attachment of the proposed modifications that outline the valid and reliable measures used to track the achievement and growth of students. Requests to participate in Option C must be submitted annually to the State Board of Education for approval at its October meeting. Once approved, a letter will be sent to the LEA/charter school with additional guidance regarding reporting outcomes from the proposed modified system.

Developmental Day Centers and schools providing special education and related services, as noted above, may select from Options B or C. The Office of Exceptional Children and the Office of Accountability and Testing will review the eligibility criteria of these schools and must approve their use of the alternative accountability modified system.

Local boards of education must approve the selected option of each identified school under their jurisdiction. For the 2023-24 school year, local boards must report this decision to the NCDPI's Office of Accountability and Testing by August 1, 2023.

Alternative School Insufficient Data Options Under ESSA

As required by ESSA state plan, all schools participating in the Alternative Schools' Modified Accountability System must select one of the following two options for the calculation of a SPG in the event the school does not have sufficient data to determine a SPG using current year data:

- a. **Return Scores** - All data is returned to base (sending) schools within the local education agency (LEA). The alternative school, or other eligible school, is given the letter grade of the school where the highest percentage of students are sent back (this option does not apply to charter schools); or
- b. **Three Years** - Use three (3) years of data to calculate the letter grade for the school.

Insufficient data option determinations must also be approved by the local or charter school board for each school under their jurisdiction. This decision must be reported to the NCDPI.

Option C: Participation in the modified system, proposing modifications to the accountability system for approval by the State Board of Education.




