MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES

November 5, 2018

The Montgomery County Board of Education convened in its regular monthly meeting on Monday, November 5, 2018 at 6:30 pm. Board members present were Steven W. DeBerry – Chair, Tommy Blake – Vice Chair, Jesse Hill, Tommy Blake, Sandra Miller and Shirley Threadgill and Bryan Dozier.

Chairman DeBerry called the meeting to order and moved to adopt the agenda as shown. Sandra Miller made the motion with Tommy Blake seconding. The agenda was accepted with unanimous approval from the board.

Chairman DeBerry read a devotional about Thanksgiving.

Troy Elementary students Gracelyn Sheffield and Zaiden Lilly led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

No one signed up to address the board during the public comment period.

The family of Currie Whitley accepted a Resolution of Esteem for his many years with Montgomery County Schools. Mr. Whitley passed away in August. The resolution reads as follows:

Troy Elementary principal Maxine Brown, along with teachers Pebble Byrd and Glendon Mabe, discussed "Educator's Handbook". "Educator's Handbook" is software that allows the user to maintain discipline referrals using a paperless system, while creating transparency in the form of communication. The teacher and principal can access the system to see the offense, the punishment given to the student and if parent contact has been made. Parents can receive an incident log of all behavioral concerns when requested. Teachers like the immediate feedback on the status of their students.

Wade Auman discussed the Business Advisory Council (BAC). The council members are school directors and principals, as well as business contacts from the county. The purpose of the council is to assist in the alignment of the CTE program and the needs of the community employers. The council will identify skill gaps to inform teachers for focused, hands on training that will provide the skillset needed to meet industry needs. Members of the BAC will serve as mentors the CTE students, being available for questions and advice through email. The committee meets six times per year and member participation has been great.

Dr. Lancaster presented policy 8305R Federal Grant Administration Procedures for approval. Sandra Miller made the motion with Tommy Blake seconding. The board approved the policy change unanimously. Dr. Lancaster introduced several policies for first reading to be approved at the December meeting.

Superintendent Ellis asked for approval of the School Improvement Plans. The plans are on the webpage for viewing. Tommy Blake made the motion to approve the plans with Bryan Dozier seconding. All members approved the plans.

Dr. Ellis gave the board an athletic update. With numbers down at both schools and no junior varsity teams at either school, Dr. Ellis asked the board to consider submitting an application to the athletic association for 2A reclassification. The application must be submitted before the deadline of November 28, and may be withdrawn if done before that date. Bryan Dozier made the motion to approve submitting the application, with Sandra Miller seconding. The board approved unanimously.

Superintendent Ellis asked the board the approve the school makeup plan as permitted by the state due to hurricane Florence. Bryan Dozier made the motion to approve the plan and Sandra Miller seconded.

Superintendent Ellis presented an update on construction at the site. The CTE building has concrete floors poured and walls going up. The high school footers are almost complete and the gymnasium floors have been poured. The high school remains on schedule, while the CTE building is behind. Over the next thirty days, the crew will begin installing trusses and decking and placing topsoil on the athletic fields as weather allows.

Dr. Ellis discussed the Student Advisory Council meeting. Students were asked to list positives and negatives at their schools and in their classrooms. Some of the positives were great teachers, class size, spirit week and smart lunch. Negatives were iReady, food is cold and taste bad, internet connection and bug/ants.

Chairman DeBerry then asked for a motion to go into closed session to discuss personnel. Jesse Hill made the motion, with Bryan Dozier seconding. The board approved entering into closed session unanimously.

After returning from closed session, Chairman DeBerry asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. With a motion by Bryan Dozier and a second by Jesse Hill, the meeting was duly adjourned.

The Montgomery County Board of Education convened in a special called meeting on Tuesday, November 20, 2018 at 6:00 pm, to interview applicants to fill the vacant board seat of Ann Long. Board members present were Steven W. DeBerry – Chair, Tommy Blake – Vice Chair, Jesse Hill, Sandra Miller and Shirley Threadgill and Bryan Dozier.

Chairman DeBerry called the meeting to order and moved to adopt the agenda as shown. Sandra Miller made the motion with Jesse Hill seconding. The agenda was accepted with unanimous approval from the board.

Chairman DeBerry then asked for a motion to go into closed session to discuss applicants and conduct interviews. Bryan Dozier made the motion, with Tommy Blake seconding. The board approved entering into closed session unanimously.

After returning from closed session, Chairman DeBerry asked for a motion to adjourn in open forum. With a motion by Bryan Dozier and a second by Tommy Blake, the meeting continued.
