# MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES

#### June 3, 2019

The Montgomery County Board of Education convened in its regular monthly meeting on Monday, June 3, 2019 at 6:30 pm at West Montgomery High School. Board members present were Steve DeBerry – Chair, Tommy Blake – Vice Chair, Jesse Hill, Sandra Miller, Bryan Dozier, Trikena Simmons and Shirley Threadgill.

Chairman DeBerry called the meeting to order and moved to adopt the agenda as shown. Bryan Dozier made the motion with Shirley Threadgill seconding. The agenda was accepted with unanimous board approval.

Chairman DeBerry read a devotional called "A Friend to Man".

Star Elementary students Phinley Hursey and Wesley Auman led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

No one signed up to address the board during the public comment period.

Superintendent Ellis, Deputy Superintendent Kevin Lancaster and Principals honored the Montgomery County Schools Employees of the Year. The winners were nominated by their Principal and were presented a plaque by the board. Recognized were Danny Parks – Auxiliary Services, Sandra Pegues – Bus Driver, Maria Delgado – Custodian, Lynn Maness – Office Support, Lashonda Douglas – Teacher Assistant, Sharon Swanke – Instructional Support, Dale Simmerman – Child Nutrition, Jessica King – Data Manager and Rebecca Rodriguez – Beginning Teacher.

Dr. Ellis and Principal JaMese Black presented East Montgomery JROTC Instructors Colonial Drew Croucher and Sergeant Juan Choate the JROTC Distinguished Unit Award. The Distinguished Unit Award is given to a Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps unit from their respective Headquarters. A review is completed on the Unit every year. The Unit is then given the opportunity to improve on the ratings given by the representative. Units must set and accomplish goals for the year to attain this award. West Montgomery JROTC Instructors Major Mark McClay and Master Sergeant Ronald Sova also won this honor. Dr. Ellis and Principal Anne McLean presented their certificate.

Chairman DeBerry asked to hold the consent agenda until closed session. The board unanimously agreed.

Heather Seawell, Principal of Montgomery Early College, discussed the Latin System. Starting the 2015-16 school year, the state converted all public high schools to a ten-point grading scale and GPA (grade point average) points are based on the letter grade range. This will cause class ranking to be more clustered and a high number of students could potentially qualify for the Valedictorian and Salutatorian spots. The SIT team reviewed current graduation procedures and calculated the highest possible weighted GPA for students in each associate degree pathway. MCEC recommends moving away from valedictorian and salutatorian and using the following scale: GPA 4.6 or higher – Summa cum laude, 4.4 to 4.59 – Magna cum laude and 4.2 to 4.39 Cum laude. To identify junior marshals, a minimum of the top six students in the junior class will serve based on their class rank at the end of the first semester of their junior year. Any student in the top ten in their class that exemplifies poor citizenship or is suspended, can be denied the privilege of being a marshal, no matter their class rank, which is based on the weighted grading scale. After discussion and a motion by Bryan Dozier and a second by Trikena Simmons, the board approved the new ranking system.

Wade Auman gave an update on the Career and Technical Education Business Advisory Council. Council representatives are school administrators, managers and vice presidents of various businesses in the county. The purpose of the council is to assist in the alignment of the CTE programming and the needs of the community employers, identify skill gaps, inform the CTE department of industry trends and advise MCS of duties to provide instruction, activities and services. The council recognizes the need for work-based learning

opportunities and continues to focus on reaching students where they are, with the use of social media and creating a district CTE presence.

Benjie Brown, Athletic Director for Montgomery Central, gave an update on the athletic department. Fall and Winter coaches are in place and uniforms have been chosen. To raise money for new equipment, East and West Montgomery have both had sales, getting rid of old equipment and uniforms and a banquet and reverse raffle was held by the booster club. The practice and travel schedules are in place for June, July and August. Schedules are planned so that students who want to play multiple sports may do so, with transportation provided as needed. The varsity football and junior varsity/varsity volleyball schedule is also complete. The next steps include the hiring of spring coaches, attending NCHSAA summer clinics, ordering spring uniforms, completing winter and spring scheduling, holding community-wide fundraisers and holding a county-wide coaches meeting.

Dr. Lancaster presented the following policies for first reading: 2330 – Board Meeting Agenda, 3101 - Dual Enrollment, 4240/7312 – Child Abuse/Reports and Investigations, 4700 - Student Records, 4705/7825R – Confidentiality of Personal Identifying Information, 7100 – Recruitment and Selection of Personnel, 7130 – Licensure, 7730 – Employee Conflict of Interest and 7940 – Classified Personnel/Suspension and Dismissal. These policies will be up for approval at the July board meeting.

Dr. Ellis updated the board on construction at the CTE/MCHS site. The CTE building has wallboard installed, the roof membrane is complete, the stairwell steps have been poured and metal rollup doors have been installed. The high school site trusses are complete in locker rooms and ninety-five percent in the auditorium and CMU walls are in progress or completed. In the next thirty days, the CTE should have the metal trim and wallboard finished, with the high school having the corridor walls erected. Construction on the roadways and parking lots continue.

During his superintendent comments, Dr. Ellis stated that over the last year he has shared monthly, the tremendous progress taking place on the construction site. Tours have taken place almost weekly, by people excited to see what was taking shape. With education being the only true path out of poverty, the county chose this education project as the building block to economic prosperity. Changing the process will produce better-prepared students. When given the choice for two new high schools or a single high school, the latter was the obvious choice. The two-school plan would have been settling; instead, we have a brand new stateof-the-art high school and Career and Technical Education center with freshmen through seniors taking college courses. Superintendent Ellis said, "Our students will get the rigorous education they deserve, both those with plans to go on to a four-year university and those wishing to develop immediate job skills. When companies visit Montgomery County they will see something that does not exist in any other county in North Carolina: a 9-14 educational facility totally self-contained on the local community college campus". He continued, "We will be setting the mark for what secondary education should look like in the 21st century. For that, I am so profoundly proud for all of our citizens. This will benefit all of us in the end, whether originally for it or against it." Dr. Ellis then discussed the fate of the buildings that house East and West Montgomery. He stated that he knows it is a touchy topic, but those buildings will revert to the county for economic development purposes. "Therefore, I will advocate whatever is necessary for the county to use those facilities for any feasible economic development purpose they see fit. The county has invested tremendously in our transformation and for that, we are thankful. As the questions continue to come up about the old buildings, my basic response is as follows: if anyone wants to use those buildings they will need to make significant capital investments, likely into the millions of dollars, millions the county could not and would not invest given their advanced age and deteriorating condition." He wrapped up his comments by saying, "Those buildings have outlived their useful life by roughly a decade at this point and without significant capital investment, will only continue to decline. It is a hard realization, but one that we will have to confront very soon."

Chairman DeBerry then asked for a motion to move into closed session to discuss personnel. Bryan Dozier made the motion, with Shirley Threadgill seconding. The board approved entering into closed session unanimously.
