As a follow-up to this item that we discussed briefly in April, I have researched the process by which we may look to dispose of items that may have sentimental and/or monetary value to members of the community. In speaking with other districts, I know Vance County "warehoused" all of their memorabilia from a recent consolidation and Ashe County is following up with their facilities staff to provide us feedback on what they did. As witnessed with a couple of items I found online (attached), it is not uncommon for auctions to take place on such items.

I do believe we either need to decide to sale the memorabilia or not sale the memorabilia. It will be a complicated and drawn out process and I do not want to "accidentally" sell something that the Board wanted to keep, or even take a bid on it for that matter. We also would have issues of where to store anything once the schools are reverted back to the County. With that thought in mind, I would recommend that we do a silent, sealed bid auction for the memorabilia. I do understand based upon the discussion last month that this may not be a unanimous sentiment or one that will be supported by a majority of the Board, but I have to make a recommendation. I serve at the pleasure of the Board and will follow through as instructed.

CLEARFIELD — The Clearfield Area School District is giving businesses and people two rare opportunities to purchase valuable equipment and pieces of school history this month.

The first auction will be held at the Clearfield Middle School starting at 8 a.m. Saturday, Aug. 15. This auction includes the sale of everything inside the building that is not part of the building itself, including bleachers, lockers, kitchen equipment, utensils, electronics, machining equipment, lab equipment, athletic equipment and more, Superintendent Terry Struble said.

This auction also includes items used in the district's arts programs over the years, including the stage curtains, musical instruments and props from old school plays.

The district closed the middle school,
Centre Elementary, Bradford Elementary
and Girard-Goshen Elementary a little
more than a year ago and consolidated its
operations to the Clearfield Area
Elementary School and the Clearfield
Area Junior-Senior High School and is
now auctioning off equipment it no
longer needs.
