Katie Hursey, Public Information Officer, discussed the 2017 "So You Think Your School Rocks" event, a collaboration by Montgomery County Schools and Communities in Schools. The student talent show, which is always a hit, surpassed attendance this year. The Board viewed a power point of the winning acts, which are chosen by fundraising and judge's scores.

Green Ridge Elementary Guidance Counselor, Anita Mashburn, presented a power point on the school counseling program. The program reaches students through whole group and individual counseling sessions. To engage the students, the program has held several fund drives including Hurricane Matthew relief, Valentine Candy Grams, an animal shelter drive, canned food drive and toy collection drive at Christmas.

Dr. Ellis discussed a publication titled "Top Ten Education Issues" issued by the Public School Forum of North Carolina. The booklet highlights the ten issues facing public schools today, including funding, Teacher and Principal pay, accountability, resources, reading improvement and needing increased state support for struggling schools.

Nelson Furr presented a power point on energy used at all sites. The presentation was a comparison of cost, usage and rates for each school for the past three school years.

Deputy Superintendent Kevin Lancaster submitted the 2017-18 Montgomery County Early College calendar for first read. The calendar will be up for approval at the April meeting.

Dr. Lancaster then presented policy code 4600: Student Fees for approval. The policy code was presented for first read at the February board meeting. Sandra Miller made the motion to approve with Tommy Blake seconding. The board approved the motion unanimously.

In Superintendent Remarks, Dr. Ellis stated that the legislative session is in full swing and there is a flurry of bills referring to education.

Chairman DeBerry then asked for a motion to adjourn and move into closed session to discuss personnel. With a motion by Ann Long and a second from Tommy Blake, the board unanimously approved going into closed session.

After returning from closed session, Chairman DeBerry asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. With a motion by Bryan Dozier and a second by Sandra Miller, the meeting was duly adjourned.
