

### Background

- Discipline Data:
  - 2016-2017 351 incidents reported in PowerSchool for a population of about 260 students in grades 3-5
  - 2017-2018 175 incidents reported for a population of about 250 students in grades 3-5
  - Suspensions were high both years:
  - 85 days of OSS assigned in 2016-2017
  - 79 days of OSS assigned in 2017-2018
  - Most common behaviors seen were: Aggressive Behavior and Physical Aggression
  - These behaviors were seen more often in the classroom with hallways/transitions next.

### Background



- PBIS 2016-2017
  - Needed to revisit/redefine
    - Behavioral expectations
    - Reward System
    - Consequences for problem behavior
    - Data Collection and the use of it for decision-making
    - PBIS Lessons
    - Link Academic and Behavioral Performance

- Educators Handbook and Rachel's Challenge
- December 2017 first look at EH as a way to capture discipline data. Needed effective and efficient way to view the data.
- February 2018 PBIS team suggested we look at a way to make improvements across the building with student behavior and overall culture.

Both implemented in Fall 2018

Students were encouraged to accept Rachel's 5 CHALLENGES and START A CHAIN REACTION.




# START A CHAIN REACTION OF KINDNESS & COMPASSION Challenge




Teachers were trained on the program the same afternoon. A parent and community event was held that evening at MCC.

#### **Chains of Kindness**

- Links are available all over the school
- Students and staff acknowledge an act of kindness by writing a link, including WHO showed the kindness and WHAT they did to display kindness
- Links are attached to form chains
- Chains are periodically linked together to create one unified chain demonstrating the progress of the kindness and compassion process, both to students and adults
