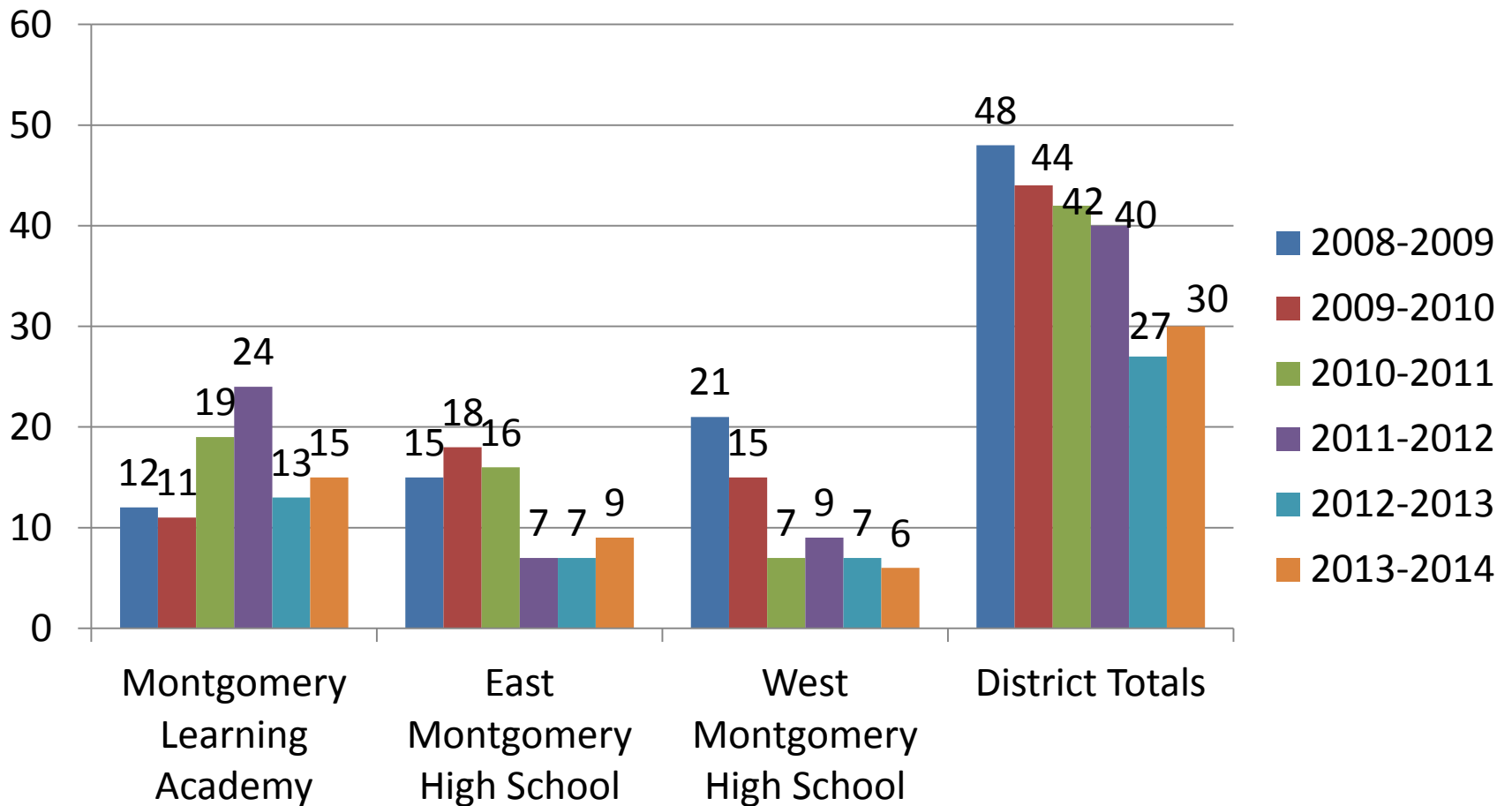

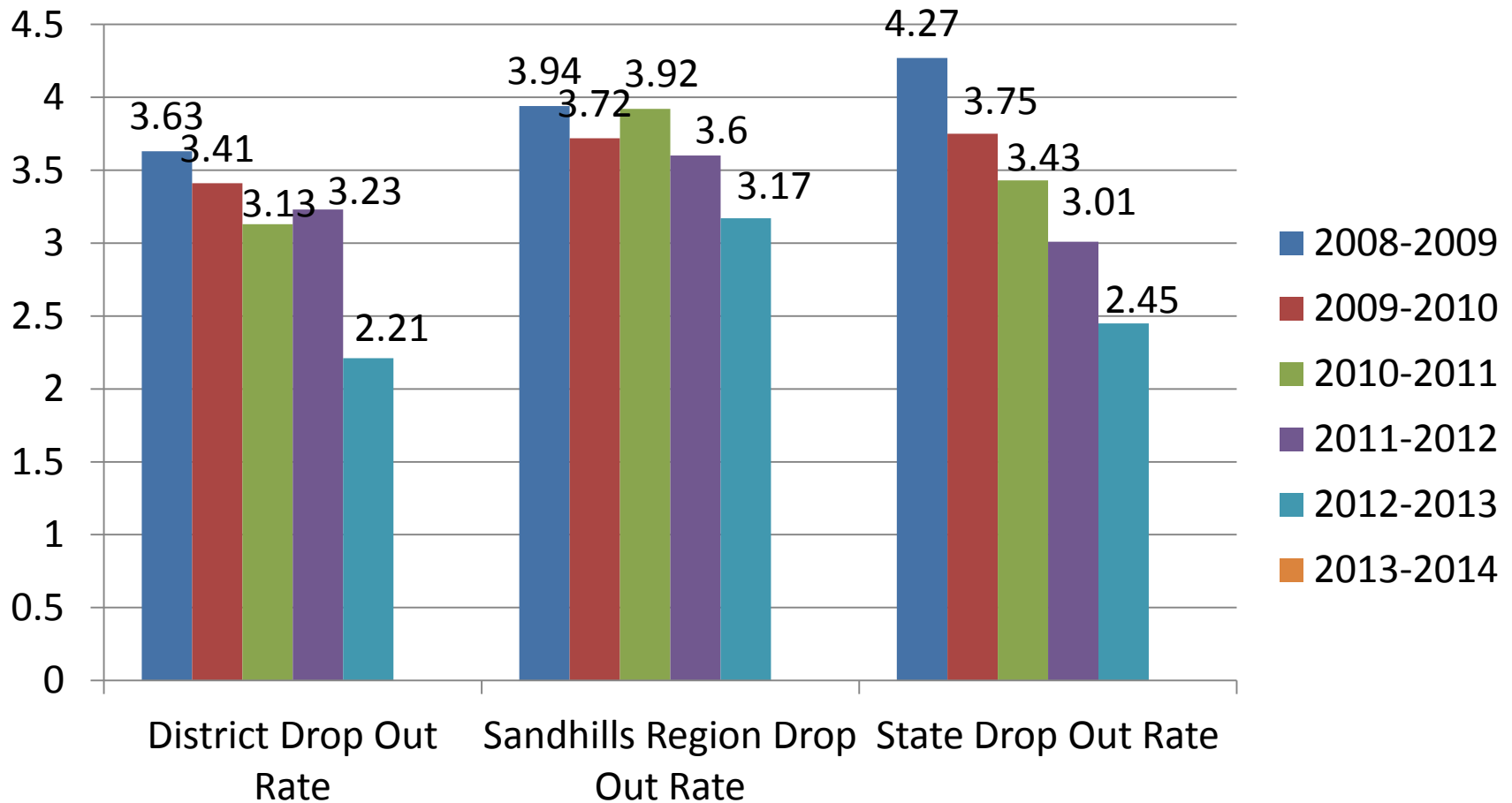
# Drop-out Count

## Six Year Trend

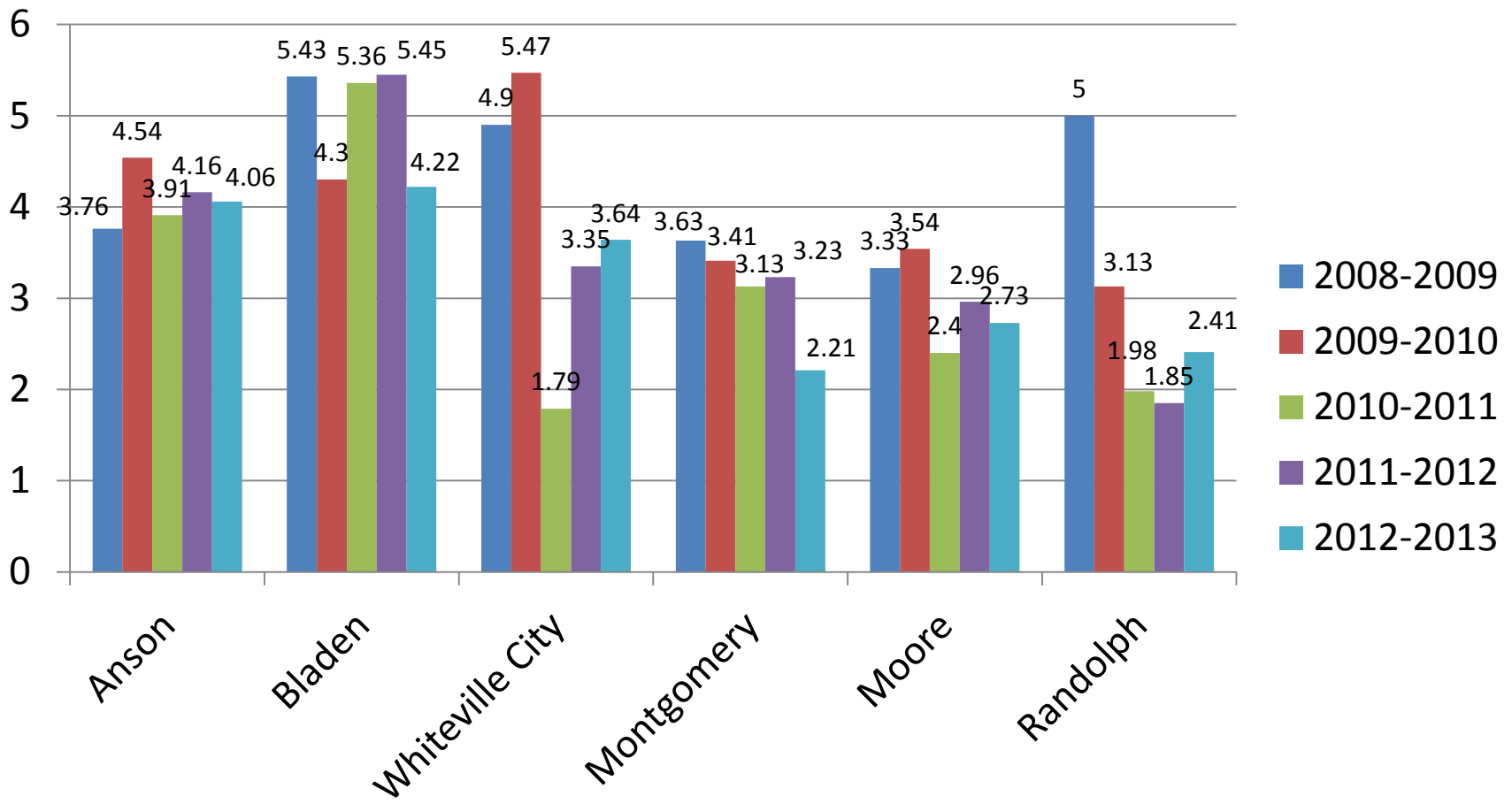


# Five Year Drop-out

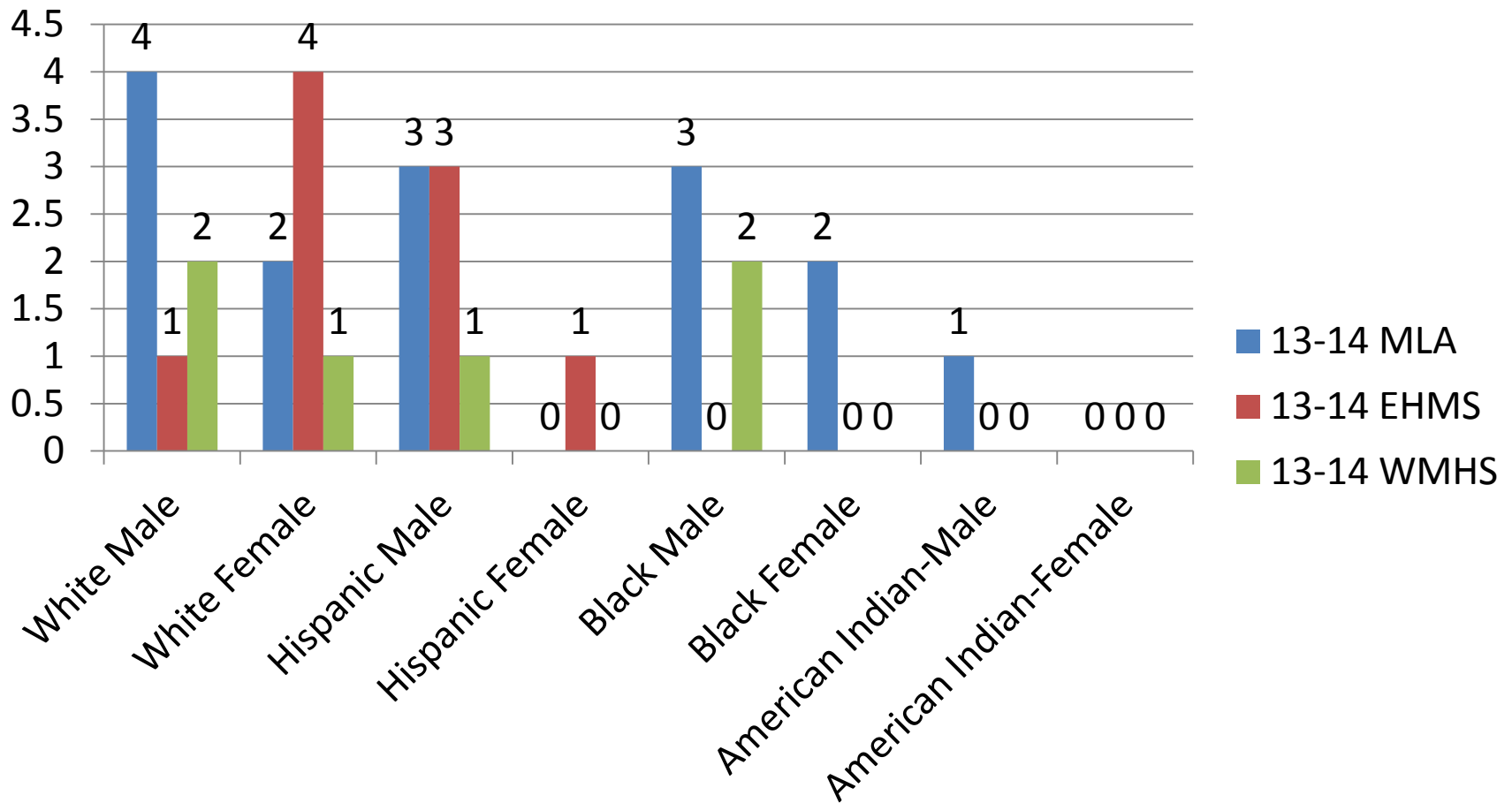
## State and Regional Comparison Rates
