What does NC Pre-K look like in Montgomery County?



Who is responsible for administering the program?



The administrator of the NC Pre-K program is Montgomery Country Schools. Montgomery County Schools will work closely with the program sites to ensure that the program guidelines and standards are met. A local advisory committee helps to develop the local NC Pre-K plan, ensuring the shared responsibility in the community and maximizing the identification and recruitment of at-risk children.



Who is eligible to participate?

• Children must be 4 years old on or before August 31st and eligible to start Kindergarten the following year. The program targets children who are at-risk of falling behind when they start Kindergarten; first priority goes to children from low income families and children of eligible military families. Other eligibility factors include children with an identified disability as indicated by the child having a current Individualized Education Plan (IEP), limited proficiency in English, a chronic health condition, and priority given to those who have not had an early childhood setting.





How much does it cost?/ When does it start and end and where are classrooms now?

- There are no costs to parents for the regular school day. However, parents may be required to pay for before and after-school care if needed. Parents should check with the Department of Social Service to see if they quality for DSS subsidy to help offset the cost of wrap-around care. Sites may also include a nominal fee for meals and/or transportation.
- NC Pre-K classrooms will follow an August-June school calendar. Slight variations on start and end time of the program day may occur at each site. Sites currently hosting classrooms are Candor Elementary, Green Ridge Elementary, Mt. Gilead Elementary, Star Elementary, Troy Elementary and Wescare Center for Children.





What special guidelines do NC Pre-K classrooms meet?

2018-2019 Monthly Attendance 172 Children

 Classes must use one of the stateapproved, research-based curriculums designed to teach early academic skills. Classes may have a maximum of 18 children, a teacher, and an assistant. Teachers must have a minimum of a BA/BS degree and hold or be working toward NC B-K.


