- Organizations must be recognized as tax exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

### **GRANT NARRATIVE RESPONSE**

- 1. Troy Elementary School is requesting funds to build a new outdoor playground, one that encourages outdoor, active play as part of our overall physical education and healthy living curriculum activities. Our goal is to be able to fund and complete the program by the end of the 2015-2016 school year. Troy Elementary School, located in Troy, NC, serves students from in and around the town of Troy. The playground would specifically benefit 290 students enrolled at Troy Elementary School; however, the area is accessible to the community and can therefore benefit the entire community and their families during non-school hours. We serve a diverse student population in a rural and economically disadvantaged area. 72.10% of Troy Elementary students receive free or reduced lunch. The breakdown of student demogrphics is 62% Caucasion, 22% African-American, 9% Hispanic/Latino, 4% Native Island/Other Pacific Islander, 2% Asian and 1% multi-racial. 14% of students are students with a disability. The student population is 53% male and 47% female.
- 2. In February 2015, Troy Elementary School began raising funds for a new school playground. While our budget may seem substantial, no monies in the budget are for capital outlay projects, so we need to raise the money required for this project. This is a large endeavor we cannot accomplish alone. Our current playground is aged, under capacity, and the cost of maintaining and updating the set makes it more sensible to raise money and puchase new equipment with adequate capacity to meet the needs of our students and community. The wonderful thing about thie project is that not only does it benefit the Troy Elementary School population, but benefits the local community by providing a healthy and fun play alternative.
- 3. Our overall goal is to see a more healthy and active student body and local community. At Troy Elementary School we believe that healthy play is important for both the physical and mental development of children. Studies show that students who are physically active also perform better academically. More and more it seems that children turn to activities that are indoor and do not promote lifelong health; however, a new playground will provide not only students of the school through our healthy living goals, but all children and families of the community a safe, fun, healthy and accessible place to play.
- 4. Outcomes. Our acadmic effectiveness is primarily measured through state academic testing. Effectivness of our physical eduation program is primarily measured through our "Fitness Gram" program that monitors BMI and student performance on various physical activity tasks. Physical education classess are only provided one time per week; however, students receive 30 minutes of recess each day. Providing a fun, healthy and active play alternative should correlate to greater increases on "Fitness Gram" scores, measured at beginning (September 2015), middle (January 2016) and end of each year (May 2016) by the Physical Education teacher, Ms. Cynthia Morgan. Increased activity should also correlate to greater improvement in academic achievement in reading and math, also measured at the beginning, middle and end of school year testing windows.
- 5. The Carolina Panthers donated apparel for inclusion in our silent auction spring fundraiser, to be held on April 17, 2015.
