
FLEXIBLE GROUPING

- What is Flexible Grouping?
- Flexible grouping is a range of grouping students together for delivering instruction.
- It creates temporary groups that allow a teacher to work a group of students on specific skills that they need extra support with or for enrichment.
- Flexible grouping is typically used in elementary schools to help students master a learning concept.

WHY FLEXIBLE GROUPING IN THE MIDDLE SCHOOL?

- Helps differentiate instruction
- Directly linked to the PDSA process
- Based on student learning needs
- Helps close achievement gaps by focusing on individual and small group needs
- Flex grouping minimizes the stigma of being different and for many students helps to reduce their anxiety of being pulled for a group.





HOW TO IMPLEMENT FLEXIBLE GROUPING

- Organize your classroom so it is conducive to small group instruction (set up, proximity). Visually can monitor all students
- Do not give students an assignment if you can't monitor it, especially on a computer. Inspect what you expect. Students need something independently that they will be accountable for (they should show proof! Some sort of product)
- Small group instruction should take place during independent practice, when students can work independently and on their own.
- How do you identify students in need of small group instruction?
 (Discussion) PDSA, Informal Assessments, check charts, etc.)
- What should small group instruction look like? What resources should be used? Can include manipulatives; should be interactive.
- When should you pull a flex group?
- Flex grouping vs. stations
- Frequency? When and how often should you utilize flex grouping? How do you when a student is ready to move out? Quiz/Assessment retakes?


